

Brazil today: Culture and Society

Brazil, a country of continental size, is a melting pot of cultures and colonial and post-colonial history, shaped by a complex social landscape. Beyond the common stereotypes, Brazil holds a profound social dynamic with specific demographic, ecological, and economic challenges as an emerging country in a globalized world.

In a time when domestic and foreign political dynamics, such as the impeachment of Bolsonaro, the changing position of the BRICS countries in the global arena, and the upcoming free trade agreement between the EU and the Mercosur countries, are being newly manifested, it is crucial to explore Brazil's societal and political development.

This seminar focuses on Brazil's diversity and provides a deep insight into its culture, politics, and economy. It delves into the superficial aspects such as geography and tradition and shows how history and multiethnic culture still strongly determine societal development. It examines the influence of different biomes on the economy, the changing structure of racism and social classes, as well as the ongoing impacts of Brazilian history on the present.

As an interactive platform, the seminar not only offers theoretical knowledge but also serves as a space for dialogue about Brazil's current changes and highlights the relevance of these developments, particularly for the EU and specifically for Germany.

Brazil is at a turning point, and this seminar invites active understanding of the challenges of this fascinating country and explores its future opportunities and strategies.
